

PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE OFFENCE

The Photographic evidence is supplied on the Infringement Notice. The images are supplied as a courtesy only. There is no legal requirement to supply photographic evidence for camera detected offences. It is important to note clearer images are used for processing and adjudication purposes. *Due to privacy principles these images cannot be viewed by any person external to the Traffic Camera Office.*

RED LIGHT CAMERA PHOTOGRAPHS:

Red Light Cameras operate automatically day or night. A Red Light Camera is connected to traffic lights is programmed to take photographs of the rear of any vehicle crossing over the stop line and entering the intersection after the lights have turned red. **The camera will not be triggered by vehicles crossing the stop line on amber or green lights.**

Once the camera is activated, it takes a series of two photographs (one second apart) of the offending vehicle. Details including time, date, lane position and number of seconds since the light turned red are included on the photographs.

Two photographs are taken to determine whether an offence under *Section 56 of the Transport Operations (Road Use Management Road Rules) Regulation 1999* has occurred.

Any vehicles already in the intersection when the traffic lights change to red do not activate the camera.

You may purchase a copy of the photographic print by forwarding a cheque or money order, made payable to the Queensland Police Service, for the amount as set down in Schedule 4 (Fees) of the Traffic Regulation 1962 to the Traffic Camera Office, GPO Box 1440, BRISBANE QLD 4001. Photographs of the incident will then be processed and forwarded to you.

Red Light Cameras operate during the hours of darkness and photograph the rear of the offending vehicle therefore the photographic evidence should not be relied upon for driver identification purposes. In most cases identification will not be possible.

Should you require a copy of the photographic evidence, you must action your request prior to the Date Due on the Infringement Notice.

SPEED CAMERA PHOTOGRAPHS:

Speed cameras are operated day or night. The camera can be operated bi-directional, programmed to take photographs of any vehicle exceeding the restricted speed limit when entering or exiting the radar beam. **The camera will not be triggered by vehicles not exceeding the speed limit.**

Once the camera is activated, it takes a photograph of the offending vehicle. Details including time, date, speed limit and travelling speed are included on the photographs.

The camera will only operate when a vehicle exceeding the speed limit enters or exits the radar beam. This will depend on the direction of travel programmed into the speed camera by the Camera Operator.

You may purchase a copy of the photographic print by forwarding a cheque or money order, made payable to the Queensland Police Service, for the amount as set down in Schedule 4 (Fees) of the Traffic Regulation 1962 to the Traffic Camera Office, GPO Box 1440, BRISBANE QLD 4001. Photographs of the incident will then be processed and forwarded to you.

Speed Cameras are operated during the hours of darkness and may photograph the rear of the offending vehicle therefore the photographic evidence should not be relied upon for driver identification purposes.

Should you require a copy of the photographic evidence, you must action your request prior to the Date Due on the Infringement Notice.

It is important to note it is not the responsibility of staff at the Traffic Camera Office to identify the driver of a vehicle captured by speed and red light cameras. This is the responsibility of the registered owner. (Refer to Service of an Infringement Notice to the Registered Owner or Statutory Declaration Options.) Furthermore, it is not the role of a Traffic Camera Office, Customer Service Member to make comment on any identifying features of a driver photographed by a camera device.
