



## Traineeships for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples

Intakes commence throughout the year at the Queensland Police Service Academy, Oxley, Brisbane.

### Opportunity to become a Queensland Police Officer

The Queensland Police Service is again offering traineeships in the Justice Entry Program for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

These traineeships are being offered as part of the Queensland Police Service's E.E.O Management Plan. The traineeship provides the education qualifications for entry into the Queensland Police Service as a police recruit, including a 100m swimming proficiency and First Aid Certificate.

Trainees who successfully undertake this program will also be eligible to receive an Australian National Training Authority endorsed qualification.

### Entry requirements

Applicants must be Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people and ideally have completed Year 12 school education with at least one or two years employment experience. Alternatively, applicants who have Year 10 education with extensive employment and life related skills which demonstrate potential to succeed as a police officer are also acceptable. Applicants must also meet police recruit entry requirements including integrity, health and fitness.

*Participants successfully completing the Justice Entry Program will be awarded the nationally recognised qualification 39251 QLD Certificate IV in Justice (Aboriginal People and Torres Strait Islander People). Funding for this qualification is currently supplied by the Queensland Government under the User Choice Program.*

\*Please note pay scales as of 1 July 2009

Applicants must hold a current Open Driver Licence to operate a motor vehicle (manual or automatic) in Australia; or a Provisional Driver Licence, with one year's driving experience and successful completion of a Defensive Driver Training course - 'Drive Vehicle in Queensland (TLIC107C)', recognised by the Queensland Police Service (QPS) prior to commencing as a police recruit.

### Duration

The traineeship is a six month full time course.

### Salary

During the traineeship, trainees will receive an allowance equal to that of a police recruit. This is an allowance of approximately \*\$1243.55 Gross per fortnight. For existing employees of the Queensland Police Service, ordinary salary or wages will be maintained for the duration of the traineeship. A choice of two accommodation/meal packages are available from \*\$174.80 approx per fortnight.
