

LEGISLATION REFERRED TO WITH CAMERA DETECTED OFFENCES

The procedures and practices of the Queensland Police Service, Traffic Camera Office are dictated by legislation. Speed and red light related infringements are deemed to be life endangering offences and not considered appropriate offences for withdrawal, therefore, no deviation from the requirements of the legislation can be considered.

Legislation and regulations directly related to speed and red light cameras in the jurisdiction of the State of Queensland includes:

- *Transport Operations (Road Use Management) Act 1995*
- *Transport Operations (Road Use Management – Road Rules) Regulation 1999*
- *State Penalties Enforcement Act 1999*
- *Traffic Regulation 1962*
- *National Measurement Act 1960 (Commonwealth)*
- *Workplace Health and Safety Act 1995.*
