

OTHER OFFENCES

1. CAN YOUR OFFICE ASSIST WITH ENQUIRIES RELATING TO OTHER OFFENCES? (EXAMPLE POLICE-ISSUED TRAFFIC INFRINGEMENT NOTICES, PARKING OFFENCE NOTICES)

No. The Traffic Camera Office can provide assistance in relation to Camera Detected Offence Notices and the Speed and Red Light Camera Program only. For enquiries relating to other offences you need to contact the relevant Police Officer, Police Station or Issuing Authority as outlined on your Infringement Notice.

2. MY VEHICLE WAS UNREGISTERED AT THE TIME OF OFFENCE

The Department of Transport and Main Roads may issue you with an infringement notice for driving an unregistered vehicle, driving a vehicle with cancelled number plates or for having no compulsory third party insurance.

3. CAN THE TRAFFIC CAMERA OFFICE ASSIST WITH ENQUIRIES RELATING TO UNREGISTERED VEHICLE OFFENCES?

No. You are required to contact the issuing authority.

If the Unregistered Vehicle Offence Notice was issued as a direct result of a Camera Detected Offence Infringement notice, the Department of Transport and Main Roads is the issuing authority.

If the Unregistered Vehicle Offence Notice was issued on the road-way by a Police Officer you need to contact that person directly.

4. CAN YOU CHECK MY TRAFFIC HISTORY AND TELL ME WHAT OTHER OFFENCES I HAVE?

No. For all enquiries in relation to your traffic history, you are required to contact the relevant state's licensing authority. For customers with a Queensland driver's licence please contact Department of Transport and Main Roads on telephone number 13 23 80
