GOOD SAMARITAN AND OFFENDER SOUGHT

Edmonton detectives are trying to locate a man known only as "Dudley". 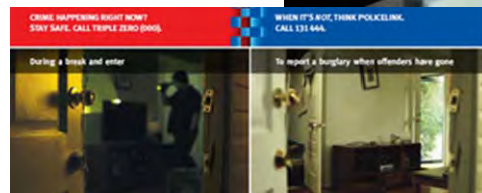

MICRODOTS



Far Northern Police are now equipped with the tools to detect the presence of Microdots on recovered property. Microdots are an easy and modern way of marking property for identification. Each dot is about the size of a grain of sand and is engraved with a unique identifying code invisible to the naked eye. The dots are applied via an aerosol can or cotton bud using a clear water-based adhesive which also contains a UV trace to assist police to detect the location of microdots.

Households and businesses can purchase microdot kits and apply the technology to the surface of valuables. Kits also contain warning stickers advising that property is marked for police identification. Queensland PCYC's are selling DATADOTS at their establishments around the state. 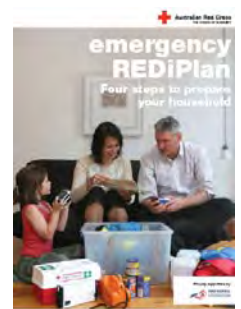
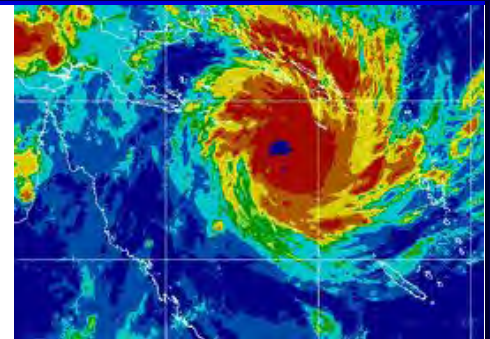
