Secure Multi-Residential Living

When it comes to security, high-rise buildings and apartments are just as vulnerable as other residential homes. Poor security habits can put the whole building at risk.

Research suggests most break-ins are preventable. It requires occupants to take a responsible approach to maintaining security in their building.

Most offenders are opportunists, searching for quick, easy entry and exit points.

Security “Yes or No” Checklist

General

1. Do you know your complex manager?
2. Do you know your Body Corporate members?
3. Has your Key holder registered his or her details with the police?
4. Do you know your neighbour?

Internal

1. Does your building have video surveillance?
2. Do you keep visitors under supervision in communal areas?
3. Do you always close communal doors?
4. Do you have keyed access to communal areas?
5. Have you removed your valuables from the garage?
6. Do you have a bike?
 - a. Have you noted the model and serial number?
 - b. Is it secured to something solid?
 - c. Is it engraved with your personal identification number?
7. Does your home have deadlocks?
8. Are your doors and windows ‘keyed alike’?
9. Do you know who has duplicate keys to your home?
10. Is your balcony secure?
11. Do you always lock your screens?
12. Has your personal property been engraved with your own individual code?

External

1. Are the exit, entry, fire exits, stairwells and other communal areas well lit?
2. Is your wheelie bin stored in the garage or otherwise secured?
3. Do your gardens allow clear vision?
4. Do you remove valuables from your vehicle?
5. Do you remove your remote from the garage?

- 5 All entries must be received by your Regional Crime Prevention Coordinator (see below for name and address) before this date. You may post your entry to your Regional Crime Prevention Coordinator or hand it in to your local police station, or to your School Adopt a Cop.
- 6 All winning entries will be **announced on 31st October 2009**. All winners will be notified by phone.
- 7 Prizes won can not be exchanged for cash or any other form.
- 8 This competition is run by the Queensland Police Service, Community Safety and Crime Prevention Branch. The judge's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

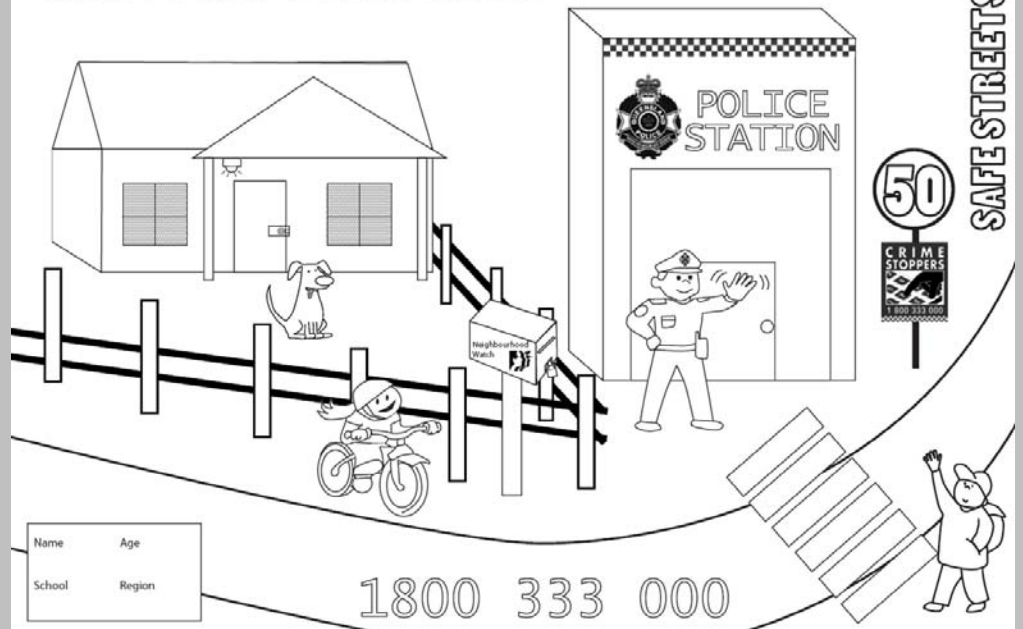

POLICE RECRUITING

5 STEPS TO GETTING HIRED

- H** **HEALTH** Applicants must be physically and medically fit to undertake the duties of an operational Police Officer
- I** **INTEGRITY** Persons applying to be appointed as a police recruit must meet very high standards with regard to their past behaviour and conduct
- R** **RESIDENCY** You must be either an Australian Citizen or hold permanent residency status or be a New Zealand citizen
- E** **EDUCATION** Applicants must have completed some TERTIARY study since leaving High School. The more work experience demonstrated the less study required
- D** **DRIVER LICENCE** You must hold either a current Australian Open Driver Licence (manual or automatic); or a Provisional Driver Licence with 12 months driving experience AND a recognised defensive driving course
