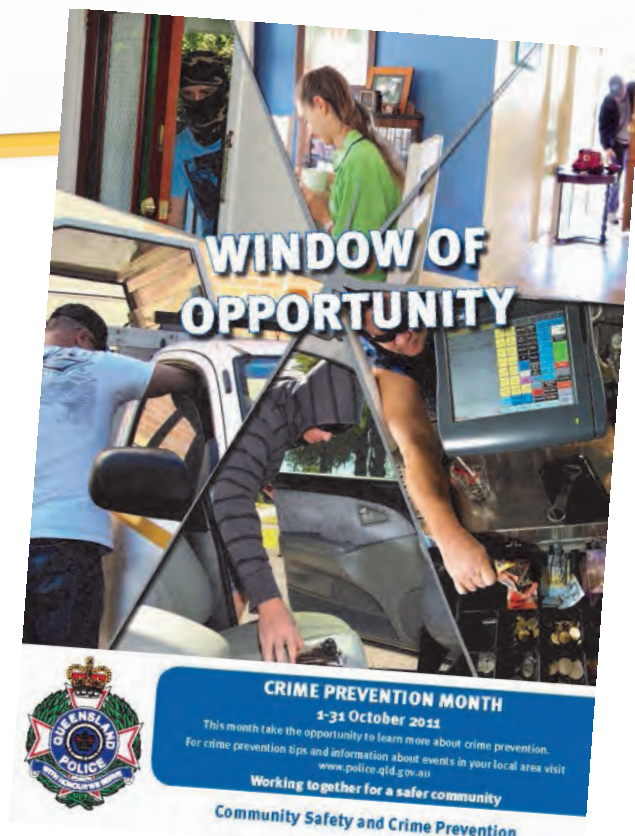

Business security - it's your business!

Make it harder for criminals to commit crime against your business. Make it less rewarding for them. Know your business's security strengths and weaknesses – physical and procedural.

- + Conduct a Business Security Assessment
- + Implement change
- + Take steps to reduce risks –merely knowing about the risks does not reduce them!
- + Not all treatment options are expensive. Some are low cost or free.
- + Identify changes you can make immediately and those that are longer term changes.



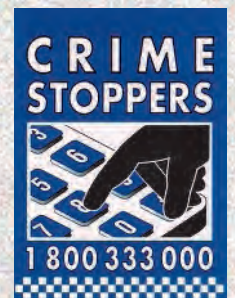
The District Crime Prevention Coordinator can help you conduct the assessment free of charge.

How to report activity to Crime Stoppers

What kind of information should callers provide?

Any information about criminal activity either current or past;

- + To be effectively investigated, this information should include things such as:
- + the names, address and vehicle registration of offender?
- + details of the crime - date, time & place?
- + The source and reliability of information given?
- + are there any vicious dogs / any firearms / weapons, etc.?
- + What is the location of the property or matter of interest?
- + The number of people residing in the location?
- + Do they work - if so - Where? When?

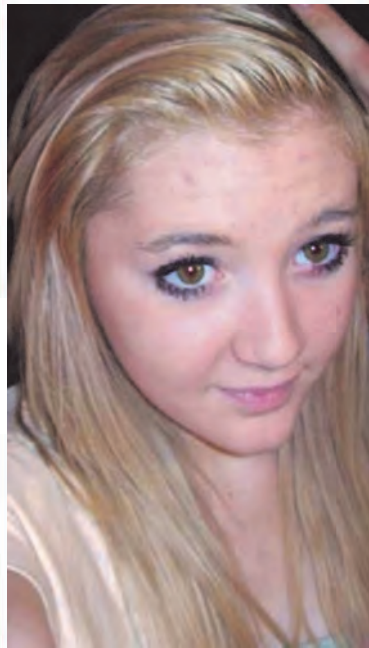


It is not expected that callers put themselves at risk to obtain such details, but information which does not give police any facts - a person's name, address or vehicle registration - is of limited use.

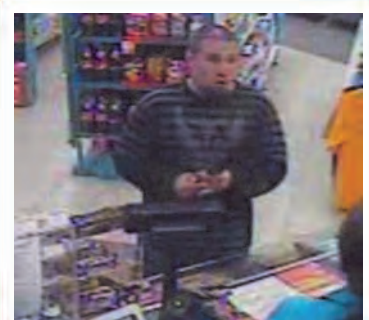

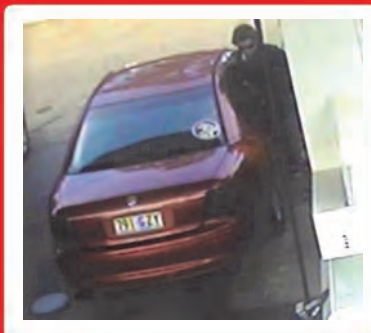

OFFENCE DETAILS

Speeding

- + **One in four** fatalities lists speeding as a contributing factor.
- + Speeding accounted for 55 QLD road fatalities in 2010.



The faster you go, the longer it takes to stop and the harder you will hit another vehicle, person or object. It's a basic law of physics and it's why speeding is not safe in any circumstance – no matter how experienced a driver you are, how good your car is, or whether you are driving on busy city streets or open country roads.

The current penalties for speeding in Queensland are as follows:

- + Less than 13 kilometres per hour (km/h) over the speed limit: A\$133 + one demerit point.
- + At least 13 km/h but not more than 20 km/h over the speed limit: A\$200 + three demerit points.
- + More than 20 km/h but not more than 30 km/h over the speed limit: A\$333 + four demerit points.
- + More than 30 km/h but not more than 40 km/h over the speed limit: A\$466 + six demerit points.
- + More than 40 km/h over the speed limit: A\$933 + eight demerit points and six month suspension.

Double demerit points apply in Queensland to drivers and motorbike riders who commit more than one of the following speeding offences within a 12 month period.
