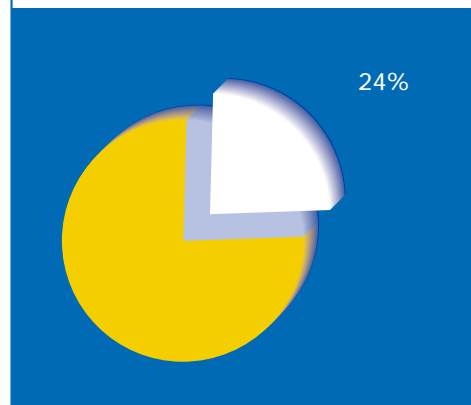
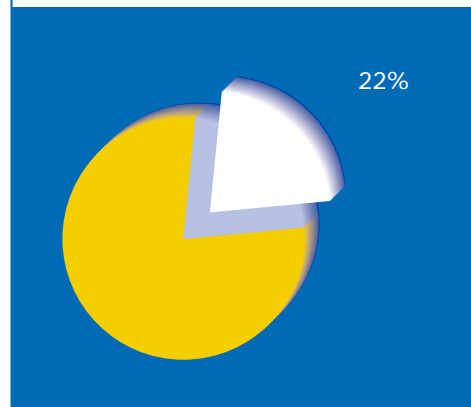
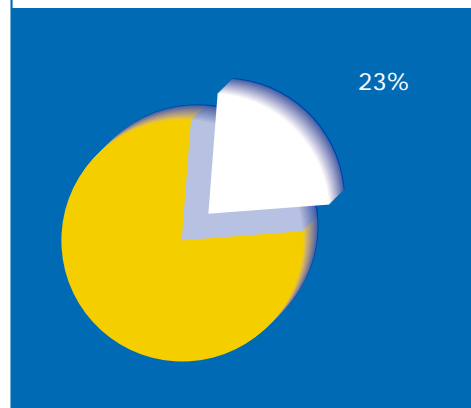
## Description

## Trends

6% increase in reported personal safety offences.

3% increase in reported property security offences.

8% increase in calls for service received at Police Communications Centre, Brisbane.

23% increase in stock offences detected by police, reflecting a range of proactive initiatives conducted by Stock Squad officers throughout the State.

## Performance 2000-01

\$0.3 million in grants to support 43 Problem-Oriented and Partnership Policing (POPP) projects over two years.

280 POPP initiatives implemented.

84% of victims of crime satisfied with police service delivery.

Six additional Police Liaison Officers appointed, bringing the total to 124.

Reduce Air Freight Theft project won a Premier's Award for Public Sector Management.

63% of Offences Against the Person cleared.

23% of Offences Against Property cleared.

77% of victims of personal safety offences and 85% of victims of property security offences satisfied with police services.

\$1.9 million allocated to facilitate introduction of DNA technology.

Provisions of *Police Powers and Responsibilities Act 2000* commenced.

Almost 600 operations conducted by State Crime Operations Command (28% increase over 1999-2000).

88% of homicides, 67% of assaults and 68% of sexual assaults reported in 2000-01 were cleared by police during the period.

Second volume of Project Axis report, examining sexual offences against children, released.

Herron and Panadol attempted extortion investigation concluded.

## Outlook 2001-02

\$2.4 million for ten new Neighbourhood Police Beats and ten new Police Beat Shopfronts over the next three years.

Six new Neighbourhood Police Beats to be established in 2001-02.

The At Risk Premises project will be expanded to at least two additional police districts.

\$0.2 million to support the development of innovative POPP initiatives.

16 Tactical Crime Squads to be introduced over three years to provide investigative and operational support to district policing strategies.

\$0.2 million allocated to establish a permanent unit to continue the work of Project Lighthouse, and deliver operational training and equipment including 2,000 new hinged handcuffs.

Maintenance of strategic partnerships with relevant agencies to address major and organised crime.

Introduction of a State Flying Squad over three years to provide specialist support to major investigations throughout the State.

\$0.3 million over three years to conduct Illicit Market Scans.

## Description

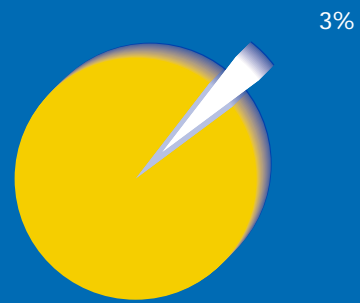
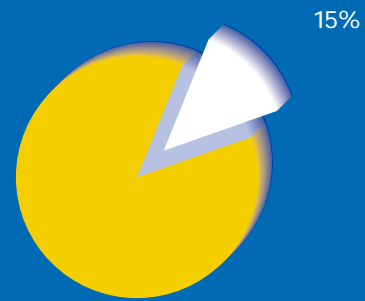
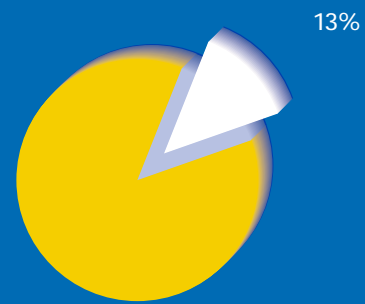
Policing services that preserve good order and safety during civil emergencies and special events.

Proactive and reactive traffic policing operations, or those activities intended to prevent or detect motorists committing traffic offences.

Activities that ensure Queensland has a police service that is fully accountable, well managed and characterised by the professionalism of its members.

Administrative, financial, information management and human resource management services that support the provision of policing services to the community.

## Resources

## Trends

12% increase in Good Order Offences detected by police.

2000 road toll of 318, marginally higher than in 1999, but 11% lower than previous five-year average.

Rate of road crash fatalities per 100,000 population (8.9) lower than national average (9.5) for third consecutive year.

10% increase in complaints against police, reflecting a greater willingness to report incidents in the regions involved in the Project Resolve trial.

## Performance 2000-01

384 preparation exercises for disasters, major incidents and special events.

17% increase in the deployment of specialist squads.

54% rate of public satisfaction with police management of public order problems.

Expansion of Railway Squad.

Provision of policing services in support of 2000 Sydney Olympic Games.

Preparation for CHOGM.

2.6 million breath tests conducted in 2000 contributing to a continuing reduction in drink driving.

15% reduction in fatal alcohol-related crashes, compared with previous five-year average.

6% increase in speed camera infringement notices, despite a 46% increase in operating hours and 35% increase in vehicles monitored.

Development of Pacific Motorway Road Safety and Enforcement Strategy.

Trial of revised discipline process (Project Resolve) conducted in two regions.

1,928 Freedom of Information requests received and 1,834 finalised.

Over 2,200 briefings provided to the Minister and Premier.

Development of Operational Performance Review process.

82% of survey respondents have confidence in police; 76% believe most police are honest; and 79% believe police perform their job professionally.

357 additional police positions approved.

60 additional staff member positions approved.

Capital works expenditure of \$28.8 million

New police station at Deeragun and replacement station at Edmonton completed.

Desktop Replacement Program delivered new computers to regional police.

## Outlook 2001-02

Ongoing preparation for the postponed CHOGM due to be held in Brisbane in 2002.

Continued upgrading of water police assets, with eight vessels scheduled for replacement in 2001-02.

Enhancement of capability to respond to chemical, biological and radiological weapons, in partnership with other emergency service providers.

Review of speed camera scheduling system with a view to extending the use of randomised, intelligence-based scheduling to other traffic enforcement activities.

Review and enhancement of 'Fatal Four' road safety campaign.

Continued investigation of digital imaging technology for speed and red light camera programs.

Continued development of Operational Performance Review process with all police districts scheduled to participate in 2001-02.

Evaluation and development of Project Resolve to continue.

Development and implementation of a Client Service Charter and Standards.

Desktop Replacement Program to continue.

Continued implementation of 10-Year Staffing Plan, with around 600 new officers recruited and trained.

Capital works expenditure of \$30.1 million.
