Energy Management

Property and Facilities Branch has coordinated a comprehensive energy management service to benefit the Service by reducing operating costs and minimising disruptions to operations.

Contestable energy contracts for Police Headquarters and the Brisbane City Watchhouse have been continued during 2004-05, while contestable energy contracts have been arranged for a further 31 sites in South-East Queensland.

In consultation with the Government Energy Management Strategy Unit and the Department of Public Works, the Queensland Police Service is trialling heat pump technology at a small number of selected sites. While the results of the tests are not yet available, it is expected that energy savings will be substantial and further work will be undertaken on this during 2005-06.

During 2005-06, the Service will continue to explore further opportunities to benefit from Energy Performance Contracts in conjunction with the Government Energy Management Unit.

Waste Management

The Service's Waste Management Strategic Plan was endorsed by the Senior Executive in 2003-04 and the initial phases of implementation have been pursued during 2004-05. The focus of the Plan is to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements and to incorporate waste management strategies as routine aspects of Service business. This has necessitated reviewing a range of the Service's functions and operations to ensure that they fully incorporate identification, reporting and corrections processes with respect to waste management.

One of the key elements this year has been to raise the awareness of management and staff about the development of the Waste Management Strategic Plan and the legal obligations of the Service. This has included making information on waste management available on the Service's Intranet site, presenting related articles in Service publications and developing and distributing a Compliance Information Pack for senior management. An educational, online support package is currently being developed to support appropriate decision-making with respect to waste management.
