

## Other Reporting

### Energy Management

Property and Facilities Branch has coordinated a comprehensive energy management service to benefit the Service by reducing operating costs and minimising disruptions to operations.

Contestable energy contracts for Police Headquarters and the Brisbane City Watchhouse have been continued during 2005-06, while contestable energy contracts have been arranged for a further 31 sites in South-East Queensland.

New contestable energy contracts for the sites currently under contract were renewed this financial year and the feasibility to enter into contracts for other sites was explored and included in the new contracts as part of the process.

The Service is continuing to trial heat pump technology and will analyse the results to ascertain if a wider application is possible.

During 2006-07, the Service will continue to explore further opportunities to benefit from Energy Performance Contracts in conjunction with the Government Energy Management Unit.

### Waste Management

The Service has introduced a comprehensive Waste Management Strategic Plan which was endorsed by the Senior Executive in 2003-04 and implemented during 2005-06. The focus of the Plan is to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements and incorporate waste management strategies as routine aspects of Service business. This has necessitated reviewing a range of the Service's functions and operations to ensure they fully incorporate identification, reporting and corrections processes with respect to waste management.

One of the key elements this year has been to raise the awareness of management and staff about the development of the Waste Management Strategic Plan and the legal obligations of the Service. This has included making information on waste management available on the Service's Intranet site, presenting related articles in Service publications and developing and distributing a Compliance Information Pack for senior management.
