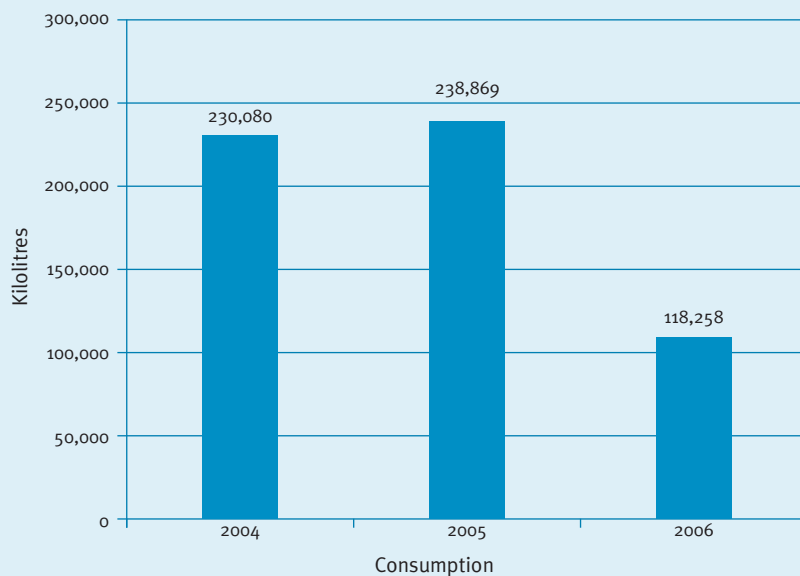
Waste Management

The Police Service has a waste management policy which includes formal online training in this area. This is available to all Police Service members and details information on proper procedures to be followed with reference to legislation and governing bodies.

Water Management

The Queensland Government has initiated a program to achieve a 25% reduction in water consumption across the State by September 2007. This is in line with the Queensland Water Commission's policy of having more efficient business water usage.

The Police Service has already conducted a desktop audit of water usage in facilities throughout South East Queensland. The following graph shows the overall water usage in these facilities has reduced by 49% between 2004 and 2006. Some facilities have reduced water consumption by over 90%.



Fitting of water efficient devices such as flow restrictors, aerators onto taps, water efficient shower roses, dual-flush toilets and sensors to reduce water consumption has commenced and will be completed by 30 September 2007.

In other locations, using less water and further water reduction strategies are being explored. Police Headquarters has already undergone an audit to retrofit water saving devices to give an estimated saving of 56.3%.

The Police Service has also joined the ecoBiz program, which is a partnership between the Environmental Protection Agency and businesses in Queensland with the goal of ecological responsibility and sustainability. EcoBiz offers information and tools to reduce waste, water and energy consumption within businesses.

Reductions in Energy Consumption

The Police Service is committed to reducing energy consumption in accordance with the Government Energy Management Strategy. Overall a 10% reduction in energy was achieved by utilising energy efficient fluorescent lighting in office buildings, energy efficient (star rated) equipment and turning off appliances when not in use.

New buildings are designed and constructed to take advantage of natural light, passive cooling (trees, shaded breezeways) and seasonal aspect, as per best practice in sustainable building development guidelines and the Building Code of Australia.

Energy performance initiatives that have been undertaken at Police Headquarters include maintenance of the air conditioning system to ensure optimum efficiency and computer-controlled lighting to minimise wastage of energy when floors are not in use.

In addition to energy efficiencies built into facilities, the Police Service is reducing energy costs through the use of Contestable Energy Contracts and a review of existing tariffs. During 2007-08, the Police Service will be investigating the use of Energy Performance Contracts in appropriate buildings.

Recordkeeping

The Registry Section is responsible for the development, review and maintenance of Police Service corporate records management policies, procedures, standards, guidelines and training programs to ensure that the Service meets its recordkeeping responsibilities under the *Public Records Act 2002*.

During 2006-07, the following activities occurred:

- completion of the Queensland State Archives Information Standard 40 Self-Assessment Checklist and Compliance Survey
- ongoing consultation with Police Service business areas to improve recordkeeping practices
- large-scale training sessions in recordkeeping practices to improve records management within the Police Service, including compliant records disposal practise
- significant contribution to the development of Whole-of Government policy and guidelines on the management of email as public records
- participation in the review of the *Queensland State Government Business Classification Scheme and Thesaurus of Administrative Terms (QKey)* to provide agencies with a relevant and standard set of terminology for use when managing administrative records.
