<p>Ian Stewart APM <b>Commissioner (Chair)</b></p> 	<p>Commissioner Ian Stewart of the Queensland Police Service (QPS) is responsible for the efficient and proper administration, management and functioning of the QPS in accordance with law. The Commissioner provides the business direction and represents the QPS at local, community, state, national and international forums and ceremonial functions.</p> <p>Commissioner Stewart is a career Police Officer with over 40 years of service having held numerous senior positions across a broad range of portfolios within the QPS. Commissioner Stewart holds a Master of Public Policy and Administration and a Bachelor of Business qualifications and is a Fellow of both the Institute of Public Administration Australia (IPAA) and Australian Institute of Management. He is also a Graduate Member of the Australian Institute of Company Directors and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Leeda Program.</p>
<p>Brett Pointing APM <b>Deputy Commissioner, Strategy, Policy and Performance (Member)</b></p> 	<p>Deputy Commissioner Brett Pointing holds responsibility for QPS Strategy, Policy and Performance through portfolio supervision of the Crime and Corruption Commission (Police Group), the Ethical Standards Command, the QPS Legal Division, the Organisational Capability Command, the Policy and Performance Division and the People Capability Command.</p> <p>Deputy Commissioner Pointing has a Bachelor of Arts (Policing) and a Master of Education (Leadership and Management). He is also a graduate of the Federal Bureau of Investigation National Academy. Deputy Commissioner Pointing was appointed the Disaster Recovery Coordinator in the wake of ex-tropical Cyclone Oswald and also lead Operation Resolute – the taskforce established to police criminal motorcycle gangs in Queensland.</p>

<p>Steve Gollschewski APM</p> <p><b>Deputy Commissioner, Commonwealth Games (Member)</b></p> 	<p>Whilst Deputy Commissioner Steve Gollschewski usually substantively holds responsibility for QPS Specialist Operations, he has recently been temporarily assigned the role of Strategic (Gold) Commander for the 2018 Commonwealth Games. Deputy Commissioner Gollschewski will continue to head counter-terrorism operations within Queensland, and will remain as the QPS representative on the Australian and New Zealand Counter Terrorism Committee.</p> <p>Deputy Commissioner Gollschewski is a graduate of the Australian Federal Police Management of Serious Crime Program, a graduate of and visiting fellow at the Australian Institute of Police Management, has completed post graduate studies in leadership through Charles Sturt University and Harvard University. He was also appointed State Disaster Coordinator in July 2013 and has coordinated the overall disaster responses to Cyclones, Ita, Marcia, Nathan and Cyclone Debbie.</p>
<p>Peter Martin APM</p> <p><b>Deputy Commissioner, Regional Operations (Member)</b></p> 	<p>Deputy Commissioner Peter Martin is responsible for ensuring the strategic direction, leadership, overview and review of the delivery of policing services to the community across the five regions state-wide. Assistant Commissioner's, designated as responsible for the management of each region, report to Deputy Commissioner Martin.</p> <p>Deputy Commissioner Martin is an Adjunct Professor at the University of Queensland. He also holds a Doctor of Philosophy in the Faculty of Health, School of Psychology and Counselling at Queensland University of Technology, an Executive Master's degree in Public Administration through the Australian and New Zealand School of Government and Griffith University, and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Justice Administration.</p>
<p>Bob Gee APM</p> <p><b>Acting Deputy Commissioner, Specialist Operations (Member)</b></p> 	<p>Acting Deputy Commissioner Bob Gee holds responsibility for the provision of QPS Specialist Operations, including portfolio supervision of Community Contact Command, Intelligence, Counter-Terrorism and Major Events Command, Operations Support Command, Road Policing Command and the State Crime Command.</p> <p>Acting Deputy Commissioner Gee has a Bachelor of Business, a Master of Public Administration and is a graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors. He has been a lecturer at various tertiary institutions and been engaged as a consultant to the private and public sectors in the fields of public administration, ethics, governance, change and risk management. He is a previous recipient of the Sir James Wolfensohn Scholarship, a program of the Harvard Club of Australia.</p>
