ATTEMPTED MURDER OF KAREN-ANN REDMILE

\$250,000 REWARD

REWARD: The Minister for Police and Corrective Services has approved a reward of \$250,000 be offered for information which leads to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the attempted murder of Karen-Ann REDMILE at Fortitude Valley on 8 February 1998.

INDEMNITY FROM PROSECUTION: In addition, an appropriate indemnity from prosecution will be recommended for any accomplice, not being the person who actually committed the crime, who first gives such information.

The allocation of the \$250 000 reward will be at the sole discretion of the Commissioner of the Police Service.

<u>CIRCUMSTANCES</u>: At about 3.30 am on Sunday 8 February 1998, the unconscious body of Karen-Ann REDMILE was located on the footpath outside 99 Harcourt Street, Fortitude Valley.

Ms REDMILE was admitted to hospital suffering severe head injuries and has not regained consciousness. A short time earlier, she had been seen talking to a male person near the intersection of Brunswick Street and Harcourt Street. Inquiries by police reveal that Ms REDMILE was overheard having a violent argument with a person with a deep voice.

Witnesses reported hearing breaking glass and a loud thumping noise coming from the vicinity of where the victim was found.
