

## What you can do

Thieves usually steal items of value which can be quickly converted to cash. Consider these steps to protect your property and valuables:

- Engrave your belongings however seek advice before using an engraver as not all items are suitable for engraving.
- Mark your property with a unique personal code in the top right hand corner of the item or near to the manufacturer's serial number.
- Use identification (ID) warning stickers on personal property, windows and doors to deter potential offenders. ID stickers are available from your local Neighbourhood Watch Group.
- Keep photographic records of your property which cannot be engraved such as jewellery, art, collectables, silverware and stamp and coin collections. Use a ruler or matchbox beside the object when taking a photo to help determine size.
- Keep a list of all serial numbers, model numbers and specific features of your personal property with a personal inventory list and keep the list and any valuation certificates in a safe place in the event of any insurance claims.
- Provide your details and personal codes to your local police.

### Inside your home

- Computers/laptops/printers • Cameras • Musical equipment • Microwaves • Kitchen appliances • Sporting goods • Furniture • Clocks

### Outside your home

- Bicycles • Power tools • Trailers • Garden tools
- Welders • Tool boxes • Lawn mowers/garden edge trimmers • Chainsaws

### In your vehicle

- Stereo system • Speakers • Navigation devices
- Tools/tool boxes • Mag wheels

### On your acreage/rural property

- Tractors • Ride-on mowers • Welders • Slashers
- Horse floats • Water pumps • Rotary hoes
- Stock crates
