Regulatory proposals where no RIA is required	<p>The Proclamation will fix 28 April 2025 for the commencement of certain parts within the <i>Queensland Community Safety Act 2024</i> namely:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Part 2, division 4, subdivision 3, other than sections 46 to 49 and section 51 which expands the regulation-making power within the <i>Police Powers and Responsibilities Act 2000</i> (PPRA) to include other persons involved in the administration of this Act (other than police officers), and also expand the definitions of <i>enforcement act</i>, <i>responsibilities code</i> and <i>missing person warrant</i> within schedule 6 of the PPRA to provide greater clarity regarding the application of these terms; and Part 3, division 3 which: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> confirms a police officer is not required to investigate domestic violence where the only relevant relationship of the two subject parties is a family relationship and one of the persons is under 18 years of age; amends the timeframe for the first mention date for the hearing of a police protection notice; and clarifies the powers of an appellate court. <p>The QPS has assessed the Proclamation as machinery in nature as it has the effect of commencing provisions not yet in force. The QPS has identified that no further regulatory impact analysis is required under the <i>Queensland Government Better Regulation Policy</i>.</p>
