

Regulatory proposals where no RIA is required	<p>The <i>Expanding Adult Crime, Adult Time and Taking a Strong Stance on Drugs and Anti-Social Behaviour Amendment Act 2026</i> (the Act) received Royal Assent on 30 April 2026. The Act makes a range of legislative reforms which seek to make Queensland safer and strengthen the capability of the criminal justice system to hold perpetrators to account.</p> <p>This includes amendments to the <i>Drugs Misuse Regulation 1987</i> which reclassify 1,4-Butanediol and 4-Hydroxybutanoic acid lactone from schedule 6 controlled substances to schedule 2 dangerous drugs.</p> <p>The Proclamation will fix 1 July 2026 for the commencement of these provisions.</p> <p>The QPS has assessed the Proclamation as machinery in nature as it has the effect of commencing provisions not yet in force. The QPS has identified that no further regulatory impact analysis is required under the <i>Queensland Government Better Regulation Policy</i>.</p>
