



Regulatory proposals where no RIA is required	<p>The <i>Expanding Adult Crime, Adult Time and Taking a Strong Stance on Drugs and Anti-Social Behaviour Amendment Act 2026</i> (the Act) received Royal Assent on 30 April 2026. The Act makes a range of legislative reforms to address issues of youth crime, drug offending and anti-social behaviour.</p> <p>This includes amendments to designate areas as Designated Business and Community Precincts (DBCPs) to respond to anti-social behaviour in central business districts and other community areas, particularly in regional Queensland. Once a DBCP has been designated, police are provided with enhanced powers to deter, detect and respond to anti-social behaviour in that area. The Act provides that amendments relating to the DBCP framework are to commence by proclamation.</p> <p>The Proclamation will fix 1 July 2026 for the commencement of these provisions.</p> <p>The QPS has assessed the Proclamation as machinery in nature as it has the effect of commencing provisions not yet in force. The QPS has identified that no further regulatory impact analysis is required under the <i>Queensland Government Better Regulation Policy</i>.</p>
